



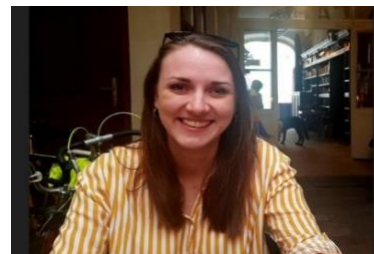
# Cheshire Chat
